"I'm not sure it can change my life but it can change my day," patient Laura Flynn says as she laughs.

Laura Flynn is taking matters into her own hands, concerning her ankle.

"When my parents see it, they're not loving it so I'm not loving it also at work with interviews with clients not sure that it's think that's professional," says Flynn.

She's not looking to permanently remove her tattoo and so "Cover FX" is perfect. It has twice as much pigment as other foundations and is water resistant. A few minutes later...what tattoo?

The artist then tackles spider veins. Doesn't look so bad? Well that's because this special makeup is already in place.

"I like to wear skirts and in the summer it bothers me more than in..the winter," says patient Renee Fisherman.

And so Renee is looking to say good bye to her spider veins through the use of a special laser.

Everyone must wear protective goggles as this treatment is carried out. It's the single most requested after hair removal. Dr. Lawrence Reed, founder of the S.T.A.R. Center calls it the "purest" form of lasers.

"It destroys the blood and lining of the blood vessel so that the vessel clots off and seals itself off," says plastic surgeon Dr. Lawrence Reed.

Sixty percent of patients need only one treatment, others see clear results within three.

Different laser, again tattoos, for religious reasons, Sara wants to get rid of them. Dr. Albert Lefkovits uses a laser which will noticeably lighten her markings in 3 to 5 sessions.

It breaks down the carbon particles into small pieces which then get swept away by your lymphatic tissue.

About 40 percent of his patients with tattoos are now opting to wipe them away. Three ladies now ready to confidently show off their legs.
